IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER Monitoring Requirements Not Met for [PWS #4020002]

Our water system violated several drinking water monitoring requirements over the past year of 2024. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct these situations.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the 2nd quarter of 2024 we did not complete all monitoring or testing for Synthetic Organic Contaminants and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time. Once the well was fully operational a sample was taken with no detects.

What should I do?

There is nothing you need to do at this time.

The table below lists the Contaminants we did not properly test for during the last year, how often we are supposed to sample for and how many samples we are supposed to take, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.

All required samples were obtained with no violations/detects. Our lab did not inform us of a small detect which resulted in Non. Repeat samples were non detect.
